On October 1, 1994 the Naval Air Station Fort Worth Joint Reserve Base was established. Units from the former NAS Dallas, NAS Glenview and NAS Memphis, caught in the 1993 BRAC, began relocating to Fort Worth.

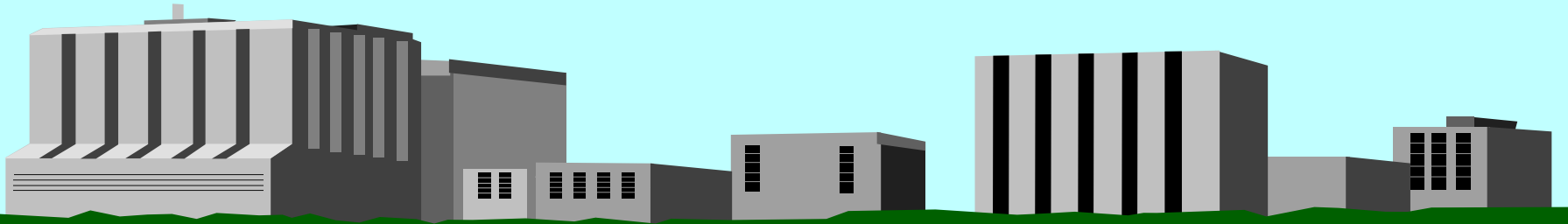

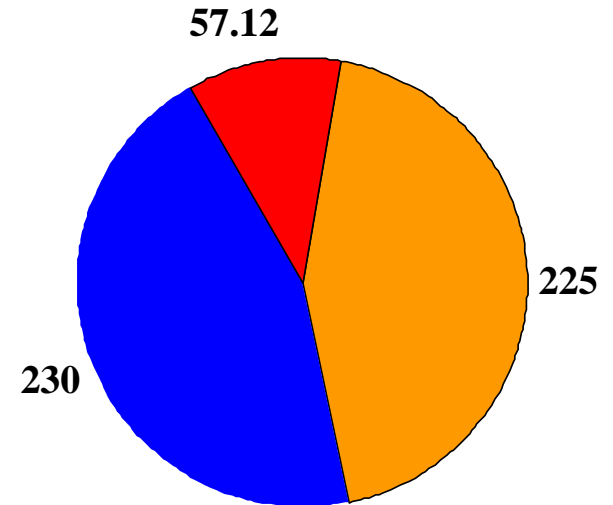
